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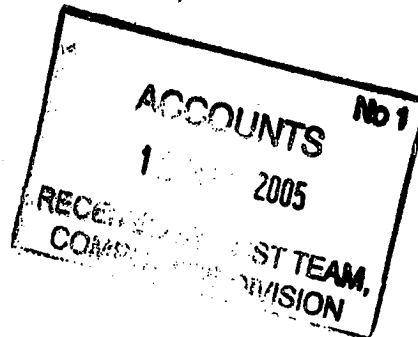

Report of the Board of Trustees

For the period ended 31 December 2004

The Board of Trustees are pleased to present their annual report and audited financial statements for the period 1 July 2003 to 31 December 2004. The legal and administrative details on page 1 form part of this report.

Objects of the Charity

The objects of the charity are:

- The promotion of any charitable purposes for the benefit of the community in the county of Cornwall and the Isles of Scilly and in particular the advancement of education, the protection of good health, both mental and physical and the relief of poverty and sickness.
- Other exclusively charitable purposes in the United Kingdom and elsewhere which are in the opinion of the trustees beneficial to the community including those in the area of benefit.

Organisation

The Foundation is constituted as a company limited by guarantee and was registered as a Charity on 10 October 2003. The Charity is administered by a board of 12 members which meets a minimum of four times a year. An Executive Director is appointed by the board to manage the day-to-day operations of the Charity.

Investment powers and policy

Under the Memorandum and Articles of Association, the Charity has the power to make any investments which the trustees see fit. The trustees regularly review internal financial information to ensure their financial position is such that it is adequate to provide sufficient resources to perform the Charity's objects in all types of conditions and to act accordingly. During the period the Trustees reflected on the need to balance risk and return on its reserves and decided to transfer away from primarily equity based investments and moved to interest bearing accounts.

Grant making policy

The Charity considers applications for funding support on a regular basis. Applications are reviewed against specific criteria and the amount granted is based on available funds.

Reserves policy

It is the trustees' view that it is prudent to accumulate free reserves to be able to cover one year's anticipated administration costs to sustain its operations, when income generating activities may temporarily cease. The trustees have initially set aside a substantial proportion of the free reserves as a development fund for the early years building of the Foundation.

Risk assessment

The trustees have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, as identified by the trustees, and systems established to mitigate those risks. This is an ongoing procedure and will be subject to regular review.

Auditors

Robinson Reed Layton were appointed auditors to the company and in accordance with Section 385 of the Companies Act 1985 a resolution proposing that they be reappointed will be submitted to the Annual General Meeting.

Statement of trustees' responsibilities

Company law requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial period which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the company and of the net incoming resources for the period then ended. In preparing those financial statements, the trustees are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in operation.

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and which enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 1985. They have general responsibility for taking such steps as are reasonably open to them to safeguard the assets of the company and to prevent and detect fraud and other irregularities.

Chairman's Review of activities and future developments

The first full year of operation of the Cornwall Community Foundation has been successful with the Foundation now fully operational having taken over with the approval of the Charity Commission, the reserves, activities and liabilities from the Cornwall Independent Trust Fund on 1 January 2004.

The detailed results are set out in page 7 to 18 and show a net increase of funds for the period of £306,641. Management income and expenditure were both within budget producing a satisfactory overall performance. The most significant activity was the income of £468,963 from DFES for the administration of the Local Network Fund for Children and Young People which enabled grants of in excess of £417,000 to be distributed throughout Cornwall. During the year a total of 126 separate grants were made totalling £436,304 supporting charities working with young people, the arts, older people, disability, equality, destitution and poverty, and community schemes.

Our London Event during October 2004 sponsored by KPMG and hosted by Lord George provided a platform to communicate to over 150 specially invited supporters and influencers. The launch of our web site provided a key communication channel to new supporters and grant seekers. During the year 75 people joined the friend's schemes with combined donations in excess of £7,000.

The creation of new Named Funds; the BBC Radio Cornwall Appeal Fund, the High Sheriff's Fund, the Lady St Levan Fund, the Lord Lieutenant's Trust Fund for Youth and the Bishop's Fund (formerly the Destitution Fund) has given us the opportunity to increase the number and range of causes we are able to support.

During 2005 the Foundation will increase focus on building the Endowment and Named Funds with particular emphasis on maintaining statutory youth funding under the Local Network Fund. In addition improvements within our grant making processes will ensure that we effectively handle larger numbers of grants. A particular theme for 2005 will be building the viability of the Foundation within Cornwall and with interested parties outside of the county.

The staff deserve credit and praise for their skilful and enthusiastic efforts to provide a successful service to a growing broad range of donors and beneficiaries in the first year as a Community Foundation. In particular Mr Allan Chesney, who was instrumental in setting up both Cornwall Independent Trust Fund and the Cornwall Community Foundation, who retired in November, must be recognised for his unstinting dedication to the Foundation and its cause. We welcome as his successor Mr Andrew Middleton whom I am confident will help us build the Foundation into an organisation which will make a real difference to Cornwall's communities.

I would like to end by thanking my fellow Trustees for their invaluable help and support.

Independent auditors' report to the Members of Cornwall Community Foundation

We have audited the financial statements of Cornwall Community Foundation for the period ended 31 December 2004 on pages 7 to 18. These financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and the accounting policies set out herein.

This report is made solely to the company's members, as a body, in accordance with Section 235 of the Companies Act 1985. Our audit work has been undertaken so that we might state to the company's members those matters we are required to state to them in an auditor's report and for no other purpose. To the fullest extent permitted by law, we do not accept or assume responsibility to anyone other than the company and the company's Members as a body, for our audit work, for this report, or for the opinions we have formed.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and auditors

The trustees' responsibilities for preparing the Trustees' Report and financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards are set out in the Statement of Trustees' Responsibilities.

Our responsibility is to audit the financial statements in accordance with relevant legal and regulatory requirements and United Kingdom Auditing Standards.

We report to you our opinion as to whether the financial statements give a true and fair view and are properly prepared in accordance with the Companies Act 1985. We also report to you if, in our opinion, the trustees' report is not consistent with the financial statements, if the charitable company has not kept proper accounting records, if we have not received all the information and explanations we require for our audit, or if information specified by law regarding trustees' remuneration and transactions with the charitable company is not disclosed.

We are not required to consider whether the statement in the Trustees' Report concerning the major risks to which the charitable company is exposed covers all existing risks and controls, or to form an opinion on the effectiveness of the charitable company's risk management and control procedures.

We read other information contained in the Trustees' Report (or, where appropriate, the Annual Report) and consider whether it is consistent with the audited financial statements. We consider the implications for our report if we become aware of any apparent misstatements or material inconsistencies with the financial statements. Our responsibilities do not extend to any other information.

Basis of opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with United Kingdom Auditing Standards issued by the Auditing Practices Board. An audit includes examination, on a test basis, of evidence relevant to the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. It also includes an assessment of the significant estimates and judgements made by the trustees in the preparation of the financial statements, and of whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the charitable company's circumstances, consistently applied and adequately disclosed.

We planned and performed our audit so as to obtain all the information and explanations which we considered necessary in order to provide us with sufficient evidence to give reasonable assurance that the financial statements are free from material misstatement, whether caused by fraud or other irregularity or error. In forming our opinion we also evaluated the overall adequacy of the presentation of information in the financial statements.

1 Constitution

The company was incorporated under the Companies Act 1985 as a company limited by guarantee and not having a share capital. In the event of the company being wound up each member is liable to contribute a sum not exceeding £1 towards the debts and liabilities of the company and the costs, charges and expenses of winding up. There were 13 members at 31 December 2004.

2 Accounting policies

2.1 Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, modified for the valuation of investments, in accordance with applicable accounting standards, and follow the recommendations in Statement of Recommended Practice: "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" (SORP 2000) issued in October 2000. As a consequence the financial statements do not include an income and expenditure account in the form specified by the Companies Act 1985. This is a departure from the statutory format of financial statements, but is required by S226(5) Companies Act 1985 to enable the financial statements to give a true and fair view. In all other respects, the financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Companies Act 1985.

The company is exempt from the requirement of financial reporting standard No1 to prepare a cash flow statement on the grounds of its size.

2.2 Incoming resources

Incoming resources are accounted for in the period in which the company is entitled to receipt.

2.3 Resources expended

Expenditure is included on an accruals basis. The irrecoverable element of VAT is included with the item of expense to which it relates.

Certain expenditure is directly attributable to specific activities and has been included in those cost categories. Certain other costs, which are attributable to more than one activity, are apportioned across cost categories on the basis of an estimate of the proportion of time spent by staff on those activities.

Grants payable are charged in the period when the offer is conveyed to the recipient except in those cases where the offer is conditional, such grants being recognised as expenditure when the conditions attaching are fulfilled. Grants offered subject to conditions which have not been met at the period end are noted as a commitment, but not accrued as expenditure.

2.4 Unrestricted and designated funds

These funds have been made available to the trustees without specific conditions. The use of these funds is entirely at the discretion of the Trustees. Designated funds are unrestricted funds earmarked by the trustees for particular purposes.

2.5 Restricted funds

These funds are made available to the trustees with specific conditions imposed by the donors as to the nature of their use.

2.6 Endowment funds

This is an expendable restricted fund arising from a public appeal by the charity.

2.7 Investments

Investments are included at market value.

2.8 Transfers

Transfers are made when appropriate from a specific fund to recover costs incurred not charged directly to that fund.

2.9 Taxation

The company is a registered charity under the Charities Act 1993 and as such is exempt from taxation on its income and capital gains.

2.10 Pensions

The pension costs charged in the financial statements represent the contributions payable by the company during the year in accordance with FRS17.

The aim of the Local Network Fund for Children and Young People, provided through the Government's Children's and Young People's Unit, is to help vulnerable children and young people achieve their potential by investing directly in the work of local community and voluntary groups that provide local solutions to the problem of child poverty.

The Elderly Fund provides grants to the elderly.

The High Sheriff's Fund supports youth led projects and activities which will serve to reduce youth crime, provide opportunities and experiences to benefit the young person and their communities.

The Lloyds TSB Foundation fund contributes towards the Development Director's salary.

The Lord Lieutenant's Fund for Youth in Cornwall aims to inspire and support ambition and talent in Cornwall's youth, particularly those of limited means, or suffering from hardship or disability, to realise their full potential.

The Lady St Levan Fund was established in memory of Lady St Levan with the aims of supporting charitable causes which she supported actively during her lifetime.

Destitution Fund (formerly St Martins Fund) provides grant assistance to individuals, families and communities in crisis situations (this was renamed the Bishop's Fund on 1 January 2005).

The Poverty Fund holds monies received from the Cornwall Independent Trust Fund on its dissolution which must be applied to relieve poverty in the county.

Travel expenses for attending meetings were paid to four trustees in the period, amounting to £939.

Included in outreach support are costs totalling £4,750 payable to a firm in which the Treasurer is a partner.

On 1 January 2004 the assets, liabilities and reserves of Cornwall Independent Trust Fund (CITF) (charity number 1071590) were transferred to this company. Several of the directors in this company were also trustees of CITF.
